

You think you know, Sasha, right? We all did. The guy with the passport to paradise and the beats that make you move. Think again.



This quiet, undulating, at times pastoral, piece is less about songs and anthems and more about texture and atmosphere.

Think of Scene Delete as somewhere between a mix album, an artist album and a gentle stroll through the soundtrack in your mind. Just make sure you switch off the lights before you enter.
